Core Knowledge

This term we will be finding out about different types of heroes - some who are real and some who aren't!

How many different heroes do you recognise?

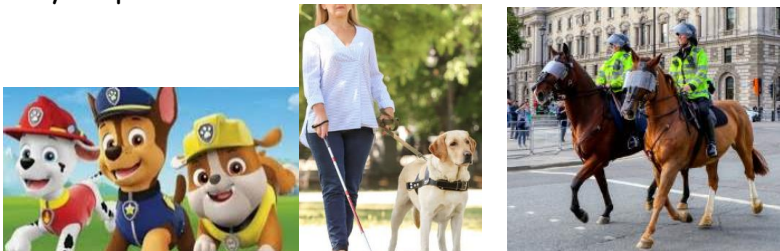
Superheroes: pretend people who have powers to help and save people.



Real life superheroes: brave, kind and caring people who live in our community (Reading). Their job is to care and help people.



Animal heroes: animals such as guide dogs and police horses are also heroes because they help us.



Key Vocabulary

Heroes



People or animals that are brave, kind and help others. They are often admired (looked up to) by others.

Fictional Superheroes



Pretend people who have special powers and they help others.

Community



A group of people living and working together in the same area.

Emergency



When someone needs help straight away.

The **emergency service** is a group of people that are here to help us e.g. doctors, vets, nurses, firefighters, the police etc.

Guide Dog



Trained to help people who are blind (they cannot see).
