

## Summaries

### Computing

- Pupils will learn about different ways of communicating long distances through the internet, and how websites are not stored locally.
- They will also create a fact sheet about themselves using images from the internet, maps and simple text.
- They will learn how they can send this as data through the internet to their Inuit friend.

### Geography

- Learn to name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.
- Learn to name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the UK.
- Understand geographical similarities and differences through studying human and physical.
- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the UK and its countries.
- Use simple compass directions and locational/directional language.

### Science

- What plants can we find around school?
- What is the same and different about the plants around us?
- What is happening in the ground under us?
- What makes a tree a tree?
- What different types of plants, leaves and flowers can be found at a garden centre?

### Music

- Traditional songs from our locality and learn some from contrasting place - the Arctic.
- Drumming, as traditional Arctic instrument, and chanting.

### Maths

Year 1: understanding the place value of tens and ones in numbers to 50 including being able to read these numbers as words. To fluently count in 2, 5 and 10s and use these facts to solve problems.

### English

#### Year 1

We will be using narrative writing to communicate a warning in the style of Goldilocks and the 3 bears. We will also be learning about the different reasons people write letters and writing a letter to inform after a special Arctic virtual tour!

#### Year 2

In English we are going to be looking at writing narrative adventure stories using the literacy shed unit 'adventures are the pits'. It is a story about a reluctant boy gets more than he asked for in a ball pit. Will he conquer his fears to escape the adventure he finds himself in?

### Art

- Pupils will design their own postcard inspired by Inuit art. They will first look at examples of Inuit art and then design their print.
- They will use the block printing technique and experiment with the technique and refine their print.
- This print will be made into a postcard. (The postcard is then used in their English work).

### RE

- Recognise some different symbols and actions which express a community's way of life, appreciating some similarities between communities.
- Find out about and respond with ideas to examples of co-operation between people who are different.
