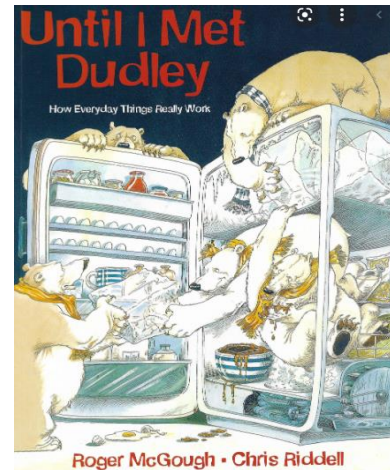


Book Knowledge Organiser - Until I Met Dudley








